WELCOME


It has been another remarkable year for Nightingale House Hospice, culminating in the successful completion of our extensive £5 million modernisation programme, which was finished on time and within budget. We owe a great deal of gratitude to our architects, TACP, our builders, Read Construction, and especially to Mike Goodwin, Project Consultant, for their exceptional work. The final phase involved a comprehensive refurbishment of the Inpatient Unit. As mentioned in last year's report, we were determined not to close the unit; instead, we reconfigured parts of the hospice to create a temporary ward

It was with much joy and excitement that patients and staff moved across the new, state-of-the-art Inpatient Unit in January, enabling the Wellbeing patients to relocate from the Bradbury Atrium back into the Wellbeing Centre.

The completion of the Inpatient Unit was made possible through the financial contributions from trusts, foundations, businesses, and local individual donors. This refurbishment funding was separate from the £4.9 million required annually to cover the hospice's operating costs, of which only 18% came from the statutory sector, highlighting a disparity with hospice funding in South Wales. The remaining funds were raised through the diligent efforts of our Income Generation Department, the ongoing support of our fundraising groups, local businesses, and community members. This was an incredible achievement, especially given the economic climate.

Throughout 2023, our new medical structure and partnership with Supportive Care UK have gone from strength to strength. Our clinical and medical staff greatly value the support, training, and development program provided by our Supportive Care consultants. As an independent hospice, we are now well-positioned to achieve our strategic goals of increasing patient capacity in a modern clinical environment and expanding our services in the future.

A significant change this year was the retirement of Steve Parry, our CEO, after seven years. He played a crucial role in enabling Nightingale House to provide high-quality, up-to-date palliative care and in achieving good governance and financial stability. We are all extremely grateful for Steve's dedication, vision, and skill, which have ensured that Nightingale House not only continues to thrive but has also developed and progressed during very challenging times. Steve mentored and developed our Deputy CEO, Lauren Emberton, and we were delighted when she accepted the role of CEO after Steve retired. This transition has proven to be successful and seamless.



This year, our staff, and volunteers in both the hospice and retail division have been exceptional in working together to improve hospice services and funding despite the disruptions caused by the final refurbishment stage. The Trustees extend their grateful thanks and appreciation for their commitment and dedication.

The Board of Trustees and Executive Management Team have continued to strive to achieve the strategic aims of the hospice and to ensure good governance and financial stability.

On a personal note, I wish to thank my Trustee colleagues, all hospice staff, volunteers and the community for their expertise, commitment, and continued support throughout another challenging year.

TRANSFORMATION COMPLETE: NEW INPATIENT UNIT AT NIGHTINGALE HOUSE



In April 2023, work began to transform our current Inpatient Unit with modern facilities and increase the number of patient rooms from ten to twelve.

TACP provided the architectural drawings of the new unit. They worked closely with the Director of Clinical and Patient Services and the wider clinical team to ensure that the facilities were suitable for patients, families, staff, and volunteers.

It was a collective effort to transfer the Inpatient Unit's current facilities to the Wellbeing Centre as a temporary measure for the eight months that construction took place. This meant that Nightingale House could continue to accommodate up to six patients for respite and end-of-life care. Staff and volunteers worked tirelessly to make the transition possible, and the temporary Inpatient Unit was fully operational in less than a week.

Once everything was removed from the Inpatient Unit, Read Construction and their subcontractors began remodelling the space, integrating piped oxygen and suction as well as creating a modern, welcoming environment.

Just before Christmas, Read Construction completed the handover of the Inpatient Unit back to Nightingale House. Read Construction Contracts Manager, Damian Bryan, said: "Working with Nightingale House Hospice on their modernisation programme over the past few years has been fantastic. We are really pleased that we could be part of such an important project, creating a modern, welcoming, first-class environment for the local community to be cared for in their time of need. We want to thank our subcontractors who donated their time, expertise, and resources to make this happen."

Staff, volunteers, and trustees were delighted to see the first glimpses of our new Inpatient Unit at the handover.

Senior Nurse, Julie Lloyd, explained: "It's like being a kid at Christmas... We've all been waiting so long to see the new Inpatient Unit. It looks absolutely fabulous! Knowing we are going to care for patients in this environment, I am so proud to work here."

Health Care Support Worker, Michelle Constantine, added: "Everyone has been quite emotional about the new Inpatient Unit. It looks even better than we ever imagined. Many patients and their families comment on how we provide a high standard of care and attention, and now we have the environment and facilities to match."

Donations from the public have helped us fund the £1.6 million modernisation of the Inpatient Unit. Laura Hughes, Ward Manager, expressed her gratitude: "We are all in awe of how the public continues to support our appeal and have raised an incredible amount of money so far, but it just keeps going up, and the funds are still very much needed to complete the finishing touches... The new facilities will allow us to care for patients long into the future."

The services available at Nightingale House Hospice allow patients with a wide range of conditions the support and care they need during the most difficult times.

At the age of 70, Ken Chesworth was dealt a devastating blow when he was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease. This news profoundly impacted him, particularly because he had always been active. This condition gradually shuts down all the muscles in the body, posing immense challenges for people like Ken.

Ken's wife, Angela Chesworth, describes how he sought support from Nightingale House Hospice even when preconceptions about hospices made him reluctant to reach out:

She said: "A family member who worked at Nightingale House asked Ken if he wanted to have a look around the hospice. Ken really didn't like the sound of a hospice and was unenthusiastic about the prospect of going. But we all said, 'Just give it a go... If you don't like it, no problem.' He went, and he never looked back. He was hooked!"

Angela talked about the services Ken accessed when he attended sessions at the hospice:

"He started going once a week to access a whole host of services. He'd have Reiki, massage, and physiotherapy sessions in the hydrotherapy pool to keep his limbs moving. He loved music therapy sessions, where he would join in with cymbals the team would strap to his feet and sing along with everybody!"

Following his diagnosis, Ken's condition slowly deteriorated.


Angela said: "As his condition worsened, the hospice invited Ken for respite care, which was a few days and sometimes a week here and there, which helped him to feel better and gave us a break that we really needed."

"Ken had said he wanted to be at home at the end. However, as his condition declined, he realised that we could no longer meet his needs at home. When it was suggested that he went to the hospice... He smiled. He was going to his second home. The hospice gave us one of their large rooms with an extra bed, and I never left his side during those final days... Ken died peacefully, without pain, and I was by his side."

The respite service provided at Nightingale House Hospice plays a crucial role in offering much-needed relief and support to patients and their families. This invaluable, no-cost service allows individuals with palliative and life-limiting conditions, as well as their loved ones, to take a moment to rest, recharge, and receive exceptional care in a nurturing environment at Nightingale House Hospice.




